What is 4/20?

4/20 originated from a group of students in the 1970's. The term was shorthand for the time of day the group would meet to smoke pot together. April 20th, (four twenty) is internationally known as Smoke Marijuana Day. There are thousands of demonstrations across the country (some political in nature), where people gather together and smoke weed at 4:20 pm.

Marijuana: What's the Big Deal?
